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ClassDoJo:



If you are new to Class Dojo, this is a tool to support communication between home and school. In a traditional setting, I use this to award students points for showing positive behaviors that they can then use to purchase class rewards.

This is a free, easy to use app that will alert you to how your child is behaving throughout the day (based on your notification settings) and can also be used to send and receive messages, reminders and updates.

If you are already signed up in Class Dojo from the previous year at Sunrise then there is nothing you need to do to sign up. If you would like information on how to sign up please let me know and I will email you a unique code for your specific child.

Supplies

Student Needs:

Sunrise is a Title 1 school which means all necessary supplies are provided for all students to ensure a successful year. Unique to this year, students will be provided a backpack with these supplies at the beginning of the year to support virtual learning. In addition to classroom supplies, students will also have learning materials such as their MyBook (Reading) and their Writing Notebook. To avoid a delay in learning when we return to in-person learning, please be sure that all materials are brought back to school so that students are prepared!

Extras:

When we return to in-person learning, supply donations are always welcome and appreciated. If you would like to donate supplies to our classroom, these are some items we are always in need of:

- Clorox sanitizing wipes
- Hand sanitizer
- Kleenex tissues
- Ziplock bags (any size)

Grading

Expectations:

- ➤ Grades will reflect the student performance of the **standards** and **essential skills** using a 1-4 scale.
- ➤ There will be no penalties for **late work** if the work is submitted within the timeframe developed by the school.
- > Students are allowed **retakes** of assessments and major graded assignments (according to the school's process) with the higher of the grades entered into the gradebook with no penalty. Retake grades will not be averaged with the original grade, the highest grade will be used for the gradebook.
- > Grades will be updated by the teacher on a weekly basis.

Homework:

During Virtual Learning, there will not be "Homework" outside of their assigned work in Canvas. Therefore, students will be expected to complete the assigned work each day.

Absent or Late Work:

If a student is unable to attend a Zoom meeting due to an illness or connection issue that's okay. There are recorded lessons in their Canvas so they can still receive the lesson and get caught up. Late work is always accepted and without a grade reduction during virtual learning.

Behavior

PAWS:

Practice Respect: Such as using kind words, actively listening to both the teacher and to peers, following directions

Accept Responsibility: Such as being on time, completing assigned work, ask questions when confused

Work together: Such as collaborating with peers, finding solutions rather than add to problems

Safety matters: Such as only using safe websites, not giving personal information out online

Behavioral Consequences:

1st time - verbal warning

2nd time - Student will be removed from the Zoom meeting. A message will be sent to the student on Canvas to meet on Zoom to discuss the behavior before the next Zoom meeting.

3rd time - if the behavior continues (or the student did not meet with the teacher) parents/guardians will be notified via email, phone call or Class Dojo

4th time - If behavior persists, then a Zoom meeting/phone conference will take place with the Parents/Guardians and possibly the Principal.
