DVUSD Opens New School

Deer Valley Unified School District's newest school Inspiration Mountain opened in August. A dedication and ribbon-cutting ceremony took place in October at the school, located at 5757 Inspiration Mountain Parkway near 57th Avenue and Happy Valley Road.

The new school serves K-6 students, with the infrastructure in place to expand to a K-8 campus. Beginning in 23-24, 7th grade will be added, with an expansion of 8th grade the following year. **Dr. Joann Schwarting**, the 2021 DVUSD Principal of the Year, was chosen to serve as Inspiration Mountain's principal.



This voter-approved, bond-funded project includes:

- Classroom buildings (45 total classrooms at full build-out)
- Multi-purpose building, which includes a gymnasium and cafeteria
- Baseball, Softball, and Soccer fields
- Playground with sunshades
- Additional features: media center and a dedicated maker space
- Site is 615,665 square feet or +/-14.13 acres
- More than 18,000 square feet of covered walkway
- 127 parking spaces
- Total construction investment \$21,235,000



Innovation Center Ribbon-Cutting Ceremony

Aspire, Deer Valley's Online Academy staff and students cut the ribbon last May, officially opening DVUSD's Innovation Center.

This center, funded through a voter-approved bond, will serve as a hub for students and staff to come together to learn, grow, and collaborate in person. One of the visionaries on this project, DVUSD Deputy Superintendent Dr. Gayle Galligan, remarked that the building had become severely underutilized after previously serving as both a warehouse and the home of DVUSD Food & Nutrition.

Aspire has grown since it was founded in 2007 to provide full-time classes for K-12 students and part-time high school advanced

placement courses, dual-enrollment, career and technical education internships, clubs, and eSports. It even provides guitar classes online!

Students in kindergarten through 6th grade participate in virtual, real-time, teacher-led instruction; 7th and 8th graders learn through a hybrid of teacher-led education and prepared resources; and 9th through 12th grade students learn through crafted resources, with open lab access to teachers during virtual and in-person office hours.

BGHS's Avenue 27 Culinary Students Win State and National Awards

During the 2021-2022 school year the Barry Goldwater High School (BGHS) Culinary team claimed the ProStart Competition State Championship title and went on to place 19th nationally at the National ProStart Invitational together. While competing individually, students earned first and second place at state competitions and ranked 6th and 12th nationally.

This program and the student-run Avenue 27 restaurant is largely made possible by community Bond dollars.

Bond Dollars have allowed DVUSD to build the facility that is home to Avenue 27, DVUSD's student-run restaurant. The restaurant creates a space where high school students are trained in all aspects of managing and running a restaurant all while gaining a true workbased learning experience in the restaurant.

These funds also support students in Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA), Careers Through Culinary Arts (C-Cap) and ProStart competitions.

Barry Goldwater High School's Avenue 27 has churned out successful culinary professionals who have moved on to work in the kitchens of Casino Arizona, the Biltmore, DC Ranch, Fox Restaurant Concepts, and the Elements at Sanctuary on Camelback.

Molasses Cookies

- 2 cups all-purpose flour (spooned and leveled)
- 11/2 teaspoons baking soda
- · 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- ¾ cup (1 ½ sticks) unsalted butter, softened
- 1 large egg
- ¼ cup molasses

DIRECTIONS

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt. In a shallow bowl, place 1/2 cup sugar; set aside.
- 2. With an electric mixer, beat butter and remaining cup of sugar until combined. Beat in egg and then molasses until combined. Reduce speed to low; gradually mix in dry ingredients, just until a dough forms.
- 3. Pinch off and roll dough into balls, each equal to 1 tablespoon. Roll balls in reserved sugar to coat.
- 4. Arrange balls on baking sheets, about 3 inches apart. Bake, one sheet at a time, until edges of cookies are just firm, 10 to 15 minutes (cookies can be baked two sheets at a time, but they will not crackle uniformly). Cool 1 minute on baking sheets; transfer to racks to cool completely.
