Dear Stetson Hills Families,

This is a friendly reminder that we have modified our arrival and dismissal procedures in order to promote social distancing. We need your help in keeping students safe! By following these simple steps, you can help us keep our parking lot flowing smoothly so we do not have large groups of students waiting.

1. If you are dropping off or picking up a student in your vehicle, do not park. Pull all the way up along the blue curb and remain in your vehicle. Students **MUST** exit on the passenger side of the car. Staff members in yellow vests will be available to assist.
2. Kindergarten students and their siblings will be dropped off on the first half of the blue line (see signage when you arrive). First through eighth grade students will be dropped off along the second half of the blue line. Please make sure you pull all the way up.
3. Do not arrive before your designated drop off or pick up time. This causes delays in the parking lot, which increases the amount of time students are waiting near each other.
4. If you prefer to meet your child and walk them home, designate an off campus meeting place. Parents may not wait at the bus-loading gate or at the front of the school as has been done in year's past.
5. Have your child/children's name displayed on a piece of paper in your front windshield. Kindergarten may use plain white paper. First through eighth grade may use the colored placards that will be provided on the first day of school.
6. Do not block the entrances to the parking lots (including the bus lot) or block the crosswalk.

NOTE: First Grade Students Day 1(September 29th ONLY)

Students may be dropped off at 8:20. Teachers will be available to walk your first grader directly to their classroom. Parents must remain in the vehicle. Parents may still drop off first graders at the normal time (between 8:30-8:45) if you wish. Your child can find any adult in a green vest and we will help them to their classroom!

Your patience is greatly appreciated as we get used to these new processes and procedures. It may take a little time, but if everyone does their part, we will have a safe and efficient arrival and dismissal process for the remainder of the year!
