Goals of Title 1

Increase academic achievement

Provide direct instructional support to students

Provide professional development for teachers

Promote parent education and involvement

Information about Title I

- Schools who qualify receive federal funding (Title I money) to <u>supplement</u> the school's existing programs. These dollars are used for...
 - > Intervention for academic and behavior
 - > Purchasing supplemental staff/programs/materials/supplies
 - Conducting parental Involvement meetings/trainings/activities
 - > Recruiting/Hiring/Retaining Highly Qualified Teachers

Requirements for Title 1

- At least 40% low income student population-identified by Free/Reduced lunch #s.
- Conduct a Comprehensive Needs Assessment.
- Identify primary needs and develop specific strategies and action steps to address those prioritized needs.
 - Create an integrated action plan based on the CNA and primary needs.
- Align Budget with Primary needs for school.
- * Monitor the integrated action plan to ensure successful academic achievement for ALL students.
- Conduct an annual evaluation of the effectiveness of the School-wide Program.

Targeted Goals:

Mountain Shadows students will improve in reading and math by 5% over last year's score.

Mountain Shadows staff will increase in awareness of PLC Fridays and increase enrollment.


Parents, We NEED YOU!
