2.	Parents and students can check their current grades through the Powerschools Website.	
3.	All prescription and over-the-counter medication must be brought into the health office by the parent/guardian and a medication administration form must be filled out. All medications must be kept in the nurse's office.

5.	How many academic classes must a Hillcrest Middle School student pass in order to be promoted to the next grade? ALL	
6.	Knowingly using information or property of another, or knowingly sharing academic information to gain an unfair advantage is defined as cheating.	
7.	Technology misuse is defined as the failure to use hardware, software, electronic devices, web pages and networks for the intended educational use or in a manner that causes disruption at a campus or any District facility.	
8.	Appropriate student behavior throughout the school year is directly related to a student's opportunity to participate in Commencement and Promotion Ceremonies. Students who engage or participate in behavior (a single event or a series of discipline issues) that violates any of the DVUSD standards for student conduct will be subject to the appropriate disciplinary consequences and may

- 11. Who is responsible for items stolen from lockers that are not locked? The student
- 12. Ditching, not attending class or reporting to sweep within 2 minutes of the bell may result in detention or suspension
- 13. What must a parent do to excuse a student who is arriving late to school?

  Accompany the student to the attendance office to excuse the tardy or absence
- 14. Jessica had excused absences from school Monday and Tuesday. When are her assignments/tests due for the days she was absent?

- 15. New laws designate threats as a felony. What are the possible consequences for making a threat, even those made as a joke? Long term suspension or expulsion and a police report will be filed
- 16. Harassment is defined as any persistent or repeated annoying or tormenting of another by a student, whether individually or in concert with other persons against another student.
- 17. Expulsion is the permanent removal of a student from school by the Governing Board.
- 18. Personal searches may be conducted by a district/school official when there is reasonable suspicion that a student is in possession of items which present an immediate danger of physical harm or illness.
- 19. Suspension from a school bus may also result in a suspension from school.
- 20. The term look -a -like drug can include any over the counter non-prescription pharmaceutical. All medications are not allowed on campus. Medication must be checked in by a parent/guardian and approved in the Health Center by the Nurse. Some examples of over the counter, non-prescription drugs include but are not limited to Tylenol Ibuprofen Midol and cold and allergy medications

- 21. What is the minimum disciplinary action taken for a student who is under the influence, intoxicated, or in possession of alcohol at school, school-sponsored events and/or school-sponsored transportation? 10 day suspension
- 22. Drugs by DVUSD definition are "Chemical substances, narcotics, prescription or non-prescription medications, inhalants, controlled substances, or substances that students represent to be chemical substances, narcotics, or controlled substances. Over the counter non-prescription pharmaceuticals fall into this definition, unless the student has complied with the school district's policy for medication. Drug Paraphernalia is defined as "Any apparatus or equipment used or capable of being used in absorbing or consuming a drug." What are the possible consequences for being in possession of these above drugs and/or paraphernalia at school or at any school related function? 10 day suspension, long-term or expulsion

- 24. Disrespect/Defiance is defined as treating district personnel or any others with contempt or rudeness.
- 25. Bullying/Cyber-bullying is the repeated acts over time that involves a real or perceived imbalance of power with the more powerful child or group attacking those who are less powerful. Bullying can be physical in form, verbal or psychological. Cyber-bullying includes bullying through the misuse of technology.
- 26. Harassing, hazing, bullying, or cyber bullying other students and adults through text messaging, twittering, posting blogs on Instagram, or any other website will result in disciplinary action
- 27. List the items that are considered weapons and could result in suspension or expulsion: includes, but is not limited to a bomb, firearm, gun, revolver, pistol, dagger, dirk, stiletto, knife with a blade over two and one-half inches long, pocket knife opened by a mechanical device, iron bar, brass knuckles, chains, billy clubs, Chinese stars or incendiary devices
- 28. When using computers on campus, what activities will result in disciplinary actions? Damaging computer systems, sharing passwords, trespassing others folders or work files, obscene language or pictures, unauthorized downloading and or any other activity deemed inappropriate/unlawful
