General Dual Enrollment Information:

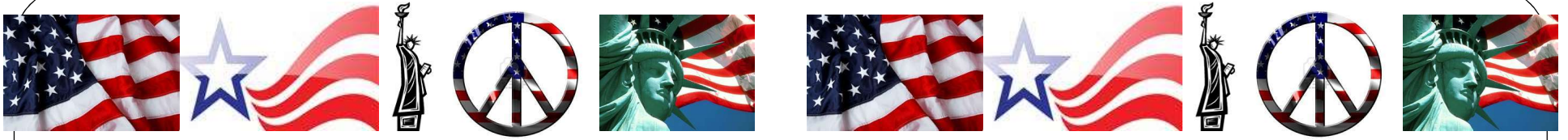
- College credit is through Rio Salado College.
- You will fully register with the college in August with your dual instructor!
- You do need to pay tuition for the class! The price for the 2020-2021 school year is \$85 per credit, plus a \$15 one time registration fee for the semester.
- Tuition – there are payment options and there are usually scholarships available through the college for qualifying students— listen to announcements in the spring!
- Attendance: 6 absences per semester (excused or unexcused) – school related functions don't count against you!
- You do not need to purchase textbooks – they are provided for you!
- These are college classes and they do have a level of rigor to them!

This year-long class will replace your English Language Arts 5-6 class!

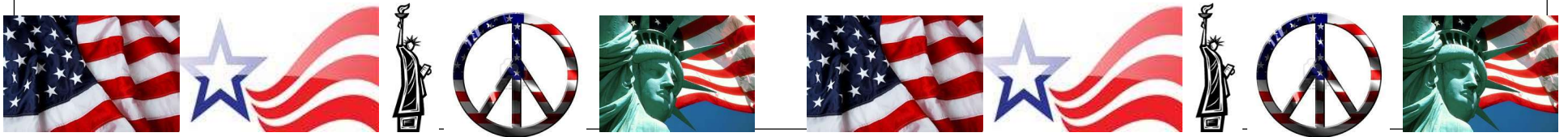

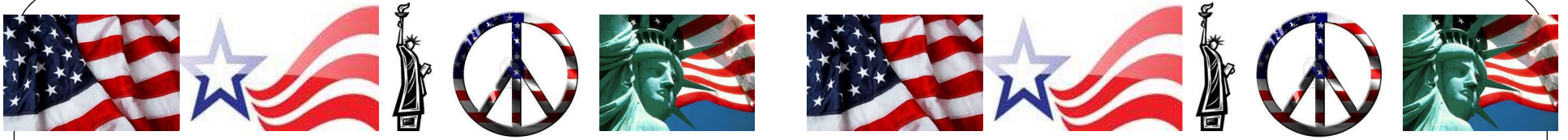


ENH 110- 3 Credits

Introduction to Literature

Introduction to international literature (with an emphasis on American literature) through various forms of literary expression: poetry, drama, essay, biography, autobiography, short story and novel. Provides a global overview of literature with special emphasis on diverse cultural contributions of women, African Americans, Asian Americans, Hispanic Americans, and Native Americans.





What will we explore?

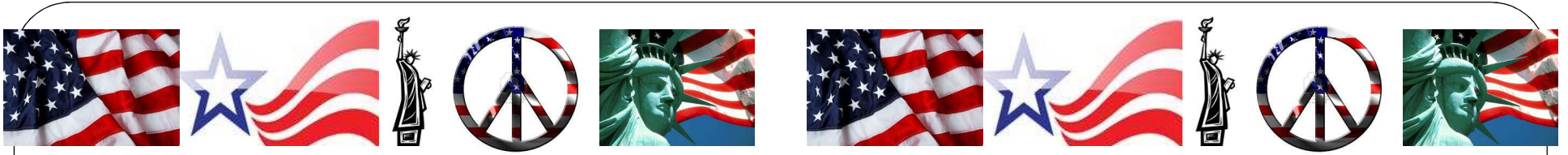
- Falls from Grace

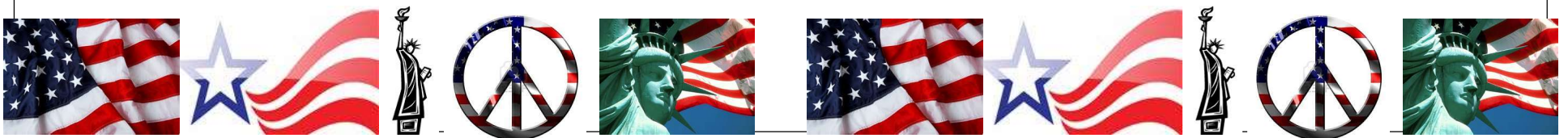


- This is a literature based class and does involve quite a bit of reading!

What do you need to be able to take junior dual?

College Admission Requirements:

Unweighted GPA of 2.6 or higher or completion of an appropriate placement assessment or previous completion of a dual enrollment course. Your teacher will be able to help you with this requirement. You only need to be admitted to the college. There is not a score you are required to achieve.

ENG 101 – First Year Composition Fall, 3 Credits

ENG 101 is designed to provide practice in the techniques of organizing and developing academic essays, but the skills and strategies it teaches are general enough to be helpful in any kind of writing. The purpose of this course is to help students write clearly and thoughtfully about any subject; students should expect to give their writing serious effort, revising their work through several stages.

Prerequisites: Unweighted GPA 2.6 or higher or an appropriate placement test score. (Your teacher will help you with this)

ENG 102 – First Year Composition Spring, 3 Credits

The second half of a two-semester sequence, this course on rhetoric and composition emphasizes further development of effective college-level writing strategies, including research-based writing.

Prerequisites: ENG 101 with a grade of "C" or better.





- ENG 101 focuses on **Expository Writing**.
- ENG 102 focuses on **Research Based Writing**.
- You can be any level of writer to succeed in ENG 101/102! We break down the writing process and build from the very basic level on up!
- ENG 101/102 is required for college/university!

So, this is an excellent opportunity to get ahead before you transfer to university!





- This is a composition based class! We do not focus on literature!
- The credits you receive from this course will most likely transfer straight across as ENG 101/ENG 102!

The Prerequisite is:

Unweighted GPA 2.6 or higher or an appropriate placement test score. (Your teacher will help you with this)
