

# Gavilan Peak Mandarin Classroom Speech Presentations



Dear Parents,

It's that time of year again! Students in grades K-8 will be participating in classroom speech presentations. They will present to their classroom peers for a Speaking grade by the end of February.

#### In Class Speech Presentation Need-to-Know:

- Students will select their grade level appropriate speech topic from the attached list.
- Students in 2<sup>nd</sup> -8<sup>th</sup> grades may choose to have a conversation with a partner instead of an individual speech (each student will have equal speaking time).
- Students will be scored using the attached rubric during their speech presentation.
- Students will receive their Speaking grade for the speech presentation by February 28<sup>th</sup>.
- Kindergarten & 1<sup>st</sup> grade:
  - o Up to a 3-minute speech including a self-introduction and the presentation.
  - o Props or posters **are not** required.
- 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grade:
  - Up to a 5-minute speech including a self-introduction and the presentation.
  - o Props or posters **are not** required.
  - Students in 2<sup>nd</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> grades will receive only *minimal* support from their teachers in writing and preparing their speech presentation. The support provided can include students consulting with their teachers for grammar and help with tones. The limited support ensures students will demonstrate their true knowledge of the topic chosen. *Outside "tutoring" is not necessary for participants, as this competition is based on what has been learned in the classroom.*

The six students with the highest earned scores for each grade level will move on to participate in the 11<sup>th</sup> Annual Mandarin Speech Competition taking place on Monday, March 10<sup>th</sup> and 11th. The competition participants and their parents will be notified by February 28<sup>th</sup>.

**When:** Tuesday, March 10, 2020 at 8:15 a.m. (grades 3-8) Wednesday, March 11, 2020 at 8:15 (grades K-2)

Where: Gavilan Peak Library

**Who:** The six individual students ( $K - 8^{th}$  grades) and 3 pairs ( $2^{nd} - 8^{th}$  grades) with the highest earned scores for each grade level will present their speech to judges, Mandarin grade level peers and parents.

#### **Speech Competition Need-to-Know:**

- Participants will be judged by Mandarin teachers from partnering DVUSD schools.
- Participants will be scored using the same rubric as used for the classroom speech presentation.
- Kindergarten & 1<sup>st</sup> grade:
  - Up to a 3-minute speech including a self-introduction and the presentation.
  - A poster to accompany the speech, created by the student is required.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> grade:
  - Students are **required** to have a PowerPoint/Google Slide presentation to accompany their speech.
    - PowerPoint/Google Slide presentation must be emailed to Mrs. Cash (<u>kim.cash@dvusd.org</u>) by <u>Sunday, March 8<sup>th</sup> at 5:00</u> pm to be used in the competition.
- Partner Competition Option: Students can choose to have a conversation with a partner
   (2 students) for their presentation.
  - The time for the conversation will be up to 6 minutes of equal amounts of speaking for each student. They may use props to accompany the conversation.
  - Conversation topics may be selected from the attached list.
  - Students are able to compete in only ONE presentation; EITHER the individual speech presentation OR the partner competition.
